The NZQA approved programmes lead to two New Zealand qualifications.

The information in this handout is about **[2861] New Zealand Certificate in Foundation Skills Level 1**.

On page 4 you can see that the qualification is aimed at young people who are struggling to achieve NCEA Level 1, possibly because of their low literacy/numeracy levels, or because they have a high level of non attendance and gaps in their learning, or are generally disengaged.

Students who embark upon the programme learn to love learning, which leads to a greater self confidence, self motivation and self esteem. Many have gone on to achieve NCEA Level 2, or moved into a tertiary setting to complete the New Zealand Certificate in Foundation Skills Level 2.

The SPEC ethos and principles embrace the inclusion principle of the NZC and ensures all students are given the opportunity to achieve and be valued. The SPEC programme embraces diversity, respects and responds to the different learning styles and needs of students, resulting in positive learning opportunities which breeds success.

The programme provides a framework to develop the skills needed for vocational pathways, and life-long learning by focusing on competency development. SPEC programmes are holistic, relevant, and can be individualised, challenging students to plan ahead and develop self motivation and self-management strategies. A 'hands on' approach and working in authentic 'real life' situations, ensures that learning is meaningful, relevant and exciting. Students engage in enquiry based learning, and develop positive interactions with other people. They learn how to reflect and improve they knowledge and skills.

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Students engage in all aspects of their learning, from the planning and decision making to the end result. They are encouraged to follow a passion or particular interest providing a crucial starting point, where students build on their strengths.

Students are encouraged to negotiate their own learning goals, and work in a learning style in which they can effectively show case their skills. There is a flexible time frame as some learners will take more time than others to achieve their goals.

There is a strong focus on facilitation of learning, rather than a teacher directed approach, and this is one of the points of difference, and a key to the success of this programme.

It is important to note that this is a **New Zealand qualification**, not just a programme.

The progression chart (page 4) shows where the Foundation Level 1 qualification sits in terms of curriculum levels.

The work undertaken at this level could help develop the necessary literacy and numeracy levels required to progress to NCEA.

Many schools are starting to offer the Foundation programme to students who are already struggling in Year 9 and 10. By offering this effective intervention students get back on track with their learning.

Although this handout focuses on the Foundation Qualification at Level 1, you can also see that there is a fit for purpose supported qualification for those students who are working around Levels 1-2 of the New Zealand curriculum.

Progression Pathways



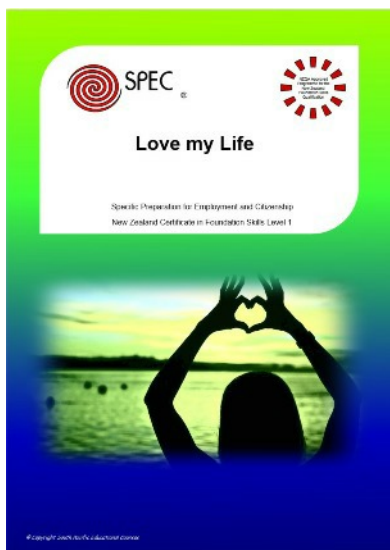
This qualification can be achieved through the NZQA approved SPEC programme, and assessed by the programme provider and the NZQA approved school.

4. Organise, interpret, and communicate information using basic literacy and numeracy skills in relevant contexts.

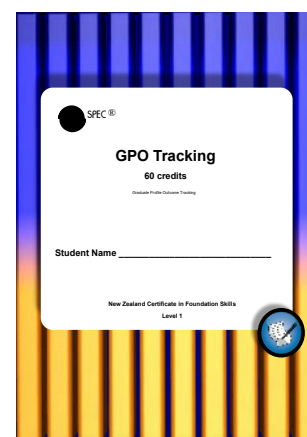

Why Offer the Foundation Qualification Level 1?

The Strategic purpose of this qualification?

The purpose of this qualification is to provide people with focused skills, capabilities, knowledge and attributes needed to engage or re-engage with learning.

Graduates will be able to operate in familiar, structured environments.

The qualification acknowledges the primacy of Te Tiriti o Waitangi in programme delivery and design.

This qualification may be suitable for students who have low literacy and /or numeracy and who are working at levels 3-5 of the New Zealand curriculum.

Is this a credible qualification?

Yes - This is a Level 1 qualification. NCEA has a specific subject focus and the Foundation qualification has a competency focus. The two really compliment each other, and for students who are struggling with NCEA, this provides a relevant alternative that can assist in 'getting them back on track' with their learning and prepare them for work.

How long does this qualification take to complete?

This depends on how much time schools allocate to the qualification per academic year.

It is a 60 credit qualification and that means that 600 notional hours of work must be allocated.


In a high school this would equate to two option lines over a two year period. Some schools decide to offer this qualification over Year 10 and year 11.

Can the credits gained in the Foundation qualification be used towards NCEA Level 1?

Schools using the SPEC programme for the Foundation qualification can achieve the qualification without having to use unit standards to achieve the credit total of 60 credits. NZQA approved SPEC criteria for the qualification using portfolio assessments as a measure of achievement.

It is possible however, to use unit standards as an additional assessment for the SPEC work a student completes. These standards would be administered and assessed by the school. Those of you who work with unit standards know that specific evidence is required in order to achieve the credits. This is determined by the standard.

The qualification is recorded on a student's Record of Learning.

The most noticeable improvement that teachers share is the personal growth they see in a student.

The shy, withdrawn and disengaged become vibrant, conscientious, focused, and able to demonstrate self-management skills, and a real willingness to challenge themselves. They become motivated and able to work with a range of other people co-operatively.

SPEC organises zoom moderation meetings where small groups of teachers from all over the country meet twice a year to moderate each others work. This provides an opportunity to network with others, share good practice and ensure there is a consistency across the whole country. Teacher's feedback shows they value the meetings and comment that it provides some of the best professional development.

Zoom moderation has opened up the opportunities for students to showcase their own work either by compiling a PowerPoint/video, or by presenting a sample of their work in person.

Many students can verbally present themselves and their skills, often far better than they can produce in a written format.

The Cost

In order to offer the programme, schools will need to become a SPEC member. This requires an annual fee.

There are three levels:

A Discretionary Membership - for up to 5 students \$350 +GST

For schools that have a total roll of 300 and want to run the programme with more than 5 students \$520 + GST

For schools that have a total roll of more than 300 and want to run the programme with more than 5 students \$640 + GST

The membership

- entitles a school to run any of the programmes.
- entitles teachers/other staff to any amount of complimentary PD throughout the year.
- entitles schools to two zoom moderation meetings.

Schools wishing to offer the qualification will need to gain approval from NZQA. This is a straightforward process.

In addition the cost of workbooks **per student** is \$82 +GST. The cost would be spread over the two academic years it would take a student to complete the programme.
